In partnership with the OSU Graduate College, Victor Baeza led efforts to launch the OSU Graduate Student Digital Badge Program. The program, which is administered through the OSU Libraries, offers a new approach to documenting and advertising learning that takes place outside of the standard classroom through our programming partners from Career Services, the Writing Center and Institutional Diversity.








Success Story



Success Story

In 2016, the OSU Library launched their Standards on Demand program. A standard is a test method, definition, or recommended practice regarding manufacturing, testing, dimensions and/or certification of raw materials and finished goods. Standards are primarily used by students and faculty in the College of Engineering, Architecture and Technology.

The Library buys online access to a number of standards, but also now purchases additional standards from IHS on an as-needed basis. Engineering Librarian, Kevin Drees oversees the project, collecting, approving and processing requests.

According to Drees, the program provides a tangible benefit to our researchers by providing much needed information without adding strain to their research funds or departmental funding. The program received notable demand from faculty in its first year.
